2021 Through Numbers


Our mission is to promote the general welfare of people with intellectual and developmental disabilities and foster the presence, participation and inclusion in the community.

We are excited to announce that over the last year we had a total of 5,663 Inclusive Interactions just within our Personal Representation Program.

The chart below categorizes inclusive interactions by intrinsic needs and critical needs. Intrinsic needs include community events, volunteering opportunities, circle meetings, as well as other activities that encompass a person's social and emotional overall wellbeing.

Critical needs include more than 46 activities inclusive of wellness visits, budget meetings, housing visits, doctor's appointments, and other activities relating to a person's health and safety.


Our Inclusive Relationships

Our Volunteers

Volunteers are a vital part of The Arc of Midland and have accomplished so much for us this year; we are so very thankful! Through the efforts of 506 volunteers, 1,412 hours of meaningful service were completed by our community members, impacting the people we serve.

We hosted 28 volunteer groups who were able to contribute a financial impact of \$40,298.48. (*Each volunteer hour valued at \$28.54) Volunteers traveled to the homes of those we serve to help with lawn care, painting, building swings/furniture and installing fire pits. They helped set up, serve and clean at our Annual Picnic and Fall into Fun events. They built basic needs kits including fun items to enhance lives.

Letters were written and gifts were created to ensure each of the people we serve know they are thought of and cared about.

The Arc of Midland has been updated with a beautiful gazebo and expanded outdoor meeting space. Plants and vegetables were donated, planted and maintained throughout the warm weather months. Safety measures were added, cabinets built, appliances and beautiful workspace donated and created. Time was

spent to help us with organization and efficiency. Each time a volunteer rolled up their sleeves to help, the people we serve felt valued. It is so easy to make a difference, please contact us to volunteer.













He works four days a week and says he'd retire, but there are too many house projects he wants to finish up before he does that. Aside from working and spending time at home, Phil also loves to bowl, which is evident when you walk into his house and you can see how he proudly displays his trophies.

The Arc of Midland is Phil's guardian, and when asking Phil about how The Arc has helped him over the last year, a few things instantly came to mind. First, the staff here supported him with getting back in touch with his family, which had been distant for many years prior. Lexi, one of our community connectors, helped Phil write letters to his family, sharing that he'd like to reconnect, and now he talks to them on the phone regularly.

After talking with Phil, it's obvious how much he loves music, specifically Miranda Lambert. Last year Phil had tickets to go to Mount Pleasant to see her at the Soaring Eagle Casino, but with a staff shortage, it looked like he didn't have anyone to take him. 
